### General Practitioner Appointments

- GAP<sup>1</sup> Payment is \$69.95 after the Medicare rebate is received.
- GAP Payment for Dr Chris Irwin is \$104.95 for all standard appointments.
- GAP Payment for Dr Angela Gavralas starts from 69.95 and increases based on consultation time.
- Concession card holders and pensioners payment is \$49.95 after Medicare rebate is received \* for Dr Grace Ho only
- All respiratory patients seen in the flu clinic will incur a full out-of-pocket charge
